SUBMISSION DEADLINE: October 31, 2025, 11:59 pm (ET)

GLCA institutions are invited to submit up to two applications from tenured Humanities faculty. Selected applicants will be appointed as a GLCA Academic Leadership Fellow holding a senior leadership position for two years on their home campus and participating in a cohort-based professional development program. A selection committee composed of academic leaders, several of whom come from a Humanities discipline, will review applications in November with decisions announced by December 2025. Application Instructions

- Through a process administered by the Chief Academic Officer's office, a GLCA
 institution may submit applications for up to two candidates. The candidate and one or
 more senior administrative officers will work together to complete the candidate's
 application.

Evaluation Criteria

<u>Candidate</u>: The candidate has demonstrated academic leadership and has the capacity for further development. Through their past actions, the candidate has demonstrated a personal commitment to advancing the institution's mission and a commitment to Humanistic educational values.

<u>Institution</u>: The institution demonstrates significant institutional commitments to the intellectual and professional development of Humanities faculty and to Humanities education for students.

Responsibilities/Project(s): The Fellow's project(s) and/or portfolio of responsibilities is strategic as articulated by the institution's senior leadership team. The project scope or scope of responsibilities is consistent with the resources available to the Fellow to advance their work in the two-year time frame. The desired outcomes are feasible given the Fellow's access to meetings, campus leaders, mentorship, and the resources needed to complete the project(s) or oversee their responsibilities within the two-year window of the Fellows Program.

<u>Professional Development Goals</u>: The Fellow's professional development goals are aspirational, and it is evident that the Fellowship – institutional support, portfolio/project, and associated mentorship – will help the Fellow advance toward the goals.
